

## Sunday School Curriculum Guide

Choosing a Sunday School curriculum can be tricky business. With so many choices, all offering something slightly different, it can be hard to figure out what's right for your context. This brief guide has been put together with the hope that it will make the process a little bit easier.

What you'll find here is a one page chart with some of the basic information about various programs. This will, at a quick glance, help you determine which programs might work for your Sunday School, but won't give you specific information. There's more information about all of the listed resources on the following pages, but you can use this first chart to narrow down your options so that the expanded chart doesn't feel so overwhelming.

Before you dive in, here are some things to think about:

- 1. What is your vision for your Sunday School?
  - Start by thinking and praying about what your Sunday School is called to be. Then think about how you can make that happen. This is about the approach that you will take, rather than the specific program you will use. Once you have a vision for what Sunday School will be, not only will that inform the type of curriculum that you choose, it will also be easier to call people to join you. People will feel more invested in helping to realize a vision than in teaching a class for 6 to 8 year olds, even if the work looks exactly the same.

- 2. How many students do you expect to attend and what is the age distribution?
  - This will help you determine what kind of program might work for you. Some curriculums are designed for one specific age range, some are designed for all ages to be together, and some have different classes for different ages. Also, take time to think about the students you will have and what might engage them specifically.
- 3. What resources do you have?
  - 1. Sunday School teachers?
    - There are (at least) three important reasons to think about this one. The first is how many teachers you have will determine how many classes you can have at the same time. The second is that all of the teachers have different gifts and skills to offer, and it's helpful if the curriculum you use utilizes those, rather than relying heavily on things that will be challenging for them. A little bit of challenge can be good, but too much can easily lead to burned-out teachers. The third thing is how much time the teachers have. If they don't have much time outside of Sunday morning, then it's important for the curriculum to be something that they can jump right into without much preparation. If they have time to offer, then that is less important.

## 2. Budget?

• This will be a huge factor in what curriculum will work for your Sunday School. There is a huge range in cost of curriculums and required materials, and there is something that will work with every budget (or no budget), but it's important to know going in what you have to work with before getting excited about a curriculum only to realize it's not feasible.

## 3. Space?

- There are lots of ways to be creative with whatever space you have, but it will help to have a sense of your space ahead of time.
   Will you be able to leave things up from week to week? Are there rooms for different age groups to break off? Does the space meet SafeR Church requirements?
- 4. How will Sunday School fit into the larger community of your church?
  - Having connections between the Sunday School and the rest of the church can be mutually beneficial, especially if it is done intentionally. Think about when Sunday School will happen. Before or after church, at the same time but separately, or at the same time with the Sunday School present for some parts of the service are all possibilities, and will impact those connections. Make sure to take your vision into consideration with this decision.
